Lectures: Lectures and practical classes provide students with theoretical basics for identifying of the major categories and principles of sociology as a science (LO1). Introduce Topics - students will be in the right mindset for understanding topics like performance appraisals if you begin class with a short video. It can be a jumping-off point for a lecture, group activity, or class discussion. And it cant to teach student to analyze, explain, evaluate, summarize knowledge about society in the context of a systematic approach with elements of structural and functional analysis (LO2). Heuristic practical tasks and research methods will enable students to learn the basic methods of collecting, processing, analyzing the results of a sociological survey and to act socially responsible (LO3). Using in practice the results of sociological research in diagnosing the causes of social conflicts will be a basis of the find innovative solutions for the creation, implementation and provision of socio-cultural needs of personality (LO4). As a result, student receive the opportunity to choose constructive and effective strategies of social interaction,

to communicate effectively and to provide, to choose effective ways of realization of results of sociological researches and social technologies in public practice (LO5).

Practical classes: practical training

Assign For Homework - Each lesson can be assigned to students as homework.

Teacher-centred direct instruction is used to help students acquire knowledge and skills. Student-centred indirect instruction is used to help students understand the political world in which they live. This unit is organized around the view that both methods belong in classes. Knowing and understanding are different but related mental processes; each is a legitimate goal of learning for all students

9. Methods and criteria for assessment

9.1. Assessment criteria

ECTS system is a model of academic process organization based on a combination of two constituents: module technology of training and credits (Test Units) and covers the content, forms and facilities of academic process, forms of checking students' knowledge and skills quality as well as academic activity of students both in class and outside it (i.e. self-study). The ECTS system aims at making students work on a systematic basis during the semester in view of their future professional success. The ECTS grading system is a system of measuring the quality of all types of classroom and self-study work done by students as well as the level of their knowledge and skills by assessing them in values according to the 100-value scale with further transfer of these values into the national scale and the ECTS system.

The grading system envisages the use of the following grades: the current module grade, the module test grade, the total module grade, the semester module grade, the examination grade and the total semester grade.

9.3 Summative assessment

The student's academic work is monitored according to a module-rating system: systematic and active student work in practical classes, testing, independent work, individual tasks, the final individual research tasks, individual practical tasks during the semester (development and implementation of training projects or presentations).

Assessment during the semester is carried out in the form of individual tasks (M1), self-testing of individual psychological characteristics (M2), attestation testing (M3), assessment of student activity in lectures (M4), writing essays (abstracts) (M5).

The student's grade is formed as follows:

- 1. Work on classes 8 points;
- 2. Conducting the survey and analyzing the results 10 points;
- 3. Attestation testing 20 points;
- 4. Completion of individual practical tasks during the semester (development and implementation of study projects or presentations) 10 points.
- 5. Essay (thesis) 12 points.
